

THE RICH DIVERSITY OF THE PÉRIGORD

Situated **in Nouvelle Aquitaine**, in south-west France, **to the east of Bordeaux**, at the gateway to Occitanie, the Dordogne offers visitors a host of sensations and emotions. A favourite destination with food-lovers, this is a fascinating area with plenty to see and do at any time of year.

Beautiful buildings such as castles, manor houses and **Romanesque churches are dotted around the countryside**, providing a magnet for anyone interested in culture and heritage. It's not by chance that Prehistoric Man chose to settle in the area 17,000 years ago. He left exceptional works of art to Humanity, such as the cave paintings in Lascaux and the **15 prehistoric sites** concentrated in the Vézère valley, which are now **listed UNESCO World Heritage sites**.

Our **10 listed villages**, our medieval bastides and our **three "Towns of Art and History"** make the Dordogne **one of the richest départements in France** in terms

of listed historical monuments.

Today, this extraordinary heritage is showcased thanks to new tours and experiences available to the public. **A visit to the new Centre International de l'Art Pariétal Montignac Lascaux** is the best example of this, with its concentration of technology and modern design combining to take visitors back on a journey to the origins of human history.

The area also offers numerous festivals and events dedicated to music, mime, film and food throughout the year.

Nature-lovers and outdoor activity enthusiasts are spoilt for choice in the Dordogne - choose from activities as diverse as canoeing, hiking and cycle touring to golf, climbing and fishing, as well as wakeboarding and pot-holing.

THE LASCAUX INTERNATIONAL CENTRE FOR CAVE ART

A sensory voyage in search of our ancestors

Situated at the foot of Lascaux hill, the **International Centre for Cave Art** in Montignac is home to a complete facsimile of Lascaux cave, alongside other high-tech exhibits offering visitors an immersive and virtual experience which appeals to all the senses.


The facsimile

One of the site's main attractions, the facsimile is a complete reproduction of the Lascaux cave paintings, created using the technical skill and expertise of the Atelier des Fac-Similés du Périgord (AFSP). In order to give visitors a chance to appreciate the paintings and enjoy an immersive experience, the atmosphere of the original cave has been completely recreated (temperature, humidity, lighting, sounds, etc...) in what is the largest facsimile of a painted cave in the world today. The site enables visitors to admire and experience the original cave in a highly authentic way.



A new visitor experience

The visit begins on a discovery path leading to the cave and finishes in a room dedicated to temporary exhibitions of contemporary art. As part of the tour, after viewing the facsimile, visitors are introduced to cave art, the Cro-Magnon civilisation and the history of work in the prehistoric world via imaging and virtual technologies used in exhibits in the Lascaux workshop and the wall art theatre. Thanks to its 3D cinema, exploring the paintings of Lascaux and other wall art from similar sites, and its gallery of painting, the International Centre for Cave Art presents prehistoric art using some of the most advanced virtual reality technologies. The centre is now a leading tourist and cultural site for the showcasing and promotion of cave art.

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A NATIONAL MUSEUM TO REDEFINE LASCAUX'S PLACE IN ITS HISTORICAL CONTEXT

An ideal introduction to the region's World Heritage Sites, the National Prehistory Museum invites visitors to discover some of the oldest traces of humanity, which are impressively exhibited in a superb contemporary setting.

Situated in the heart of the Vézère Valley between Le Bugue and the Lascaux cave in Montignac, the village of Les Eyzies-de-Tayac is highly deserving of its nickname, "the world capital of prehistory". Built alongside the monumental cliff which is an integral part of this historic museum, the exhibition rooms at the Musée National de Préhistoire are crammed with stone tools, works of art carved from bone and ivory, life-size reconstructions of prehistoric man, and extinct animals, all of which provide an insight into the development of human society over the past 400,000 years.

Recommendations for smaller, more unusual sights to complement a visit to the museum:

The Abri du Poisson in Les Eyzies-de-Tayac is home to the earliest image of a fish discovered to date (dating back to around 25,000 BC). The fish in question is a life-size salmon which measures more than a metre in length.

The Abri de Cap Blanc in Marquay boasts the only monumental sculpted prehistoric frieze that can be seen by the general public.

Working in the fields of art, fashion, construction and interior design, these "artists" protect the skills which have made French style renowned across the world and provide a fascinating insight for those who are passionate about maintaining French aesthetic traditions.

Atelier des Fac-similés du Périgord, A passion for creative reproductions

The Atelier des Fac-Similés du Périgord company specialises in creating facsimiles of prehistoric cave art. Their creations include the International Centre for Cave Art in Montignac Lascaux, two panels from the Niaux caves in the Ariège and Ekainberri in the Spanish Basque country. The company's highly qualified artisans reproduce as exact a replica as possible their subject (reliefs, surface appearance, decoration, etc...) using a combination of technological tools (3D surveys, digital photos and computer-assisted design) and patented techniques and materials.

Thanks to these highly skilled copyists, visitors can once again marvel at these historical artefacts..

Pastels Giraults:

The oldest manufacturer of dry pastel sticks still in business today

The same techniques and family tradition since 1780

The dry pastel stick is a French invention dating back to Renaissance, although it wasn't until the 18th century that the sticks became famous thanks to Quentin de la Tour. Degas also used these pastels in his paintings in the 19th century. Although these pastels have been made and exhibited in the Dordogne since 1998, Pastels Girault was actually founded in Paris in 1780. The company was awarded the "Entreprise du patrimoine Vivant" label in 2013.

Karine Loiseau, the founder's niece, and her husband Stéphane, continue to keep this family tradition alive here in the land of Cro-Magnon man, who can be considered the "first pastel painter in France".

Although painting with dry pastel sticks has become a niche technique in France, this art form is fortunately very popular in other parts of Europe, as well as in the United States and other parts of the world.

Courses and masterclasses run by renowned pastel painters are regularly organised by the company.

This company was founded in 1928 by Jean Ferignac. Although it now specialises mainly in carpentry and joinery, the company also offers a range of complementary skills such as cabinet-making, sculpture, decorative wrought-iron work, polychrome woodwork and gilding, all of which are essential skills for the conservation of our heritage. Ateliers Ferignac boasts numerous references, having worked on projects ranging from the renovation of the wooden roof structures of Hautefort, Biron and Mont-moreau castles to the restoration of the joinery in the Château d'Yquem, the square fort in Collioure and the Brittany parliament building.

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EXCELLENCE IN THE RESTORATION OF HISTORICAL HERITAGE

The Dordogne departement has the highest number of listed historic monuments in France after Paris. Let's take a close look at two companies in the Perigord whose work involves the conservation of some of the most famous architectural monuments in France and around the world.

Saint Astier, a "finely crafted" natural lime

Since the mid-19th century, lime production has been an important industry in the Isle Valley. For four generations, the "Chaux et enduits de Saint Astier" family business has been making and processing top quality natural hydraulic lime with unequalled expertise.

The quality of this lime is appreciated by architects from around the world and the lime has been used in numerous prestigious restoration projects, including the Sagrada Familia in Barcelona, the Metropolitan Museum of New York, the Tower of London, Mont Saint Michel and the Pont Neuf in Paris.

A unique visit: The factory is open to visitors every Wednesday in summer. Learn all about the production process and visit the underground quarries (about 20m below ground), where this marly siliceous limestone, the mineral properties of which are unique in Europe, is quarried.

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OUR MASTER LAUZIER STONEMASONS WORKING TO RESTORE THE REGION'S HISTORIC MONUMENTS

The castles of the Périgord enjoy a facelift

Their silhouettes are familiar sights to locals, hidden in the curve of a valley or perched on a rocky outcrop. From medieval fortresses to Renaissance chateaux, and fortified houses to manor houses, the "land of a thousand and one castles" has something for everyone !

Renovating or restoring these monuments full of history is a task which requires much thought and preparation. The work must be carried out by experts in their field who have experience working with historic buildings and traditional materials.

The master lauzier stonemason, A time honoured professional skill

The roofing technique known in French as "en tas de charge" has survived thanks to master lauzier stonemasons who have taught themselves this traditional skill which is in danger of being lost today.

The restoration project planned for the Château de Castelnaud makes an important contribution to the conservation of the region's heritage, shining the spotlight in particular on the remarkable skills of the lauzier stonemasons.

Thierry Chapoulie is one of the few lauzier stonemasons who keep this traditional craft alive in Saint-Geniès. Working with lauze stone creates unique results. The techniques used date back generations and vary depending on the stone used for the roofing, the shape of the roof in question, and the skills used in different regions.

A monumental technical challenge at the Château de Castelnaud

Built on a rocky spur, this fortified castle boasts magnificent views of the Dordogne valley. Founded in the 12th century, the castle is a perfect example of a medieval fortress.

Following three major restoration projects which brought the castle back to life and led to the creation of the Musée de la Guerre au Moyen Âge (Museum of Medieval Warfare) in 1985, a new project is underway to restore the lauze stone roof of the main building in conjunction with Thierry Chapoulie, a specialist in lauze stone from the Périgord.

Favorite

The Château de Fénelon in Sainte Mondane is one of the few castles in the region to be crowned with an imposing lauze stone roof, which requires a strong chestnut wood framework to support it. Aware of the importance of main-taining this precious piece of local heritage, the owners have recently restored the 15th century roof and wooden structure of the castle's Tour des Confitures.

Château de Commarque

This constantly evolving fortress offers a whole host of fascinating activities


Situated near Les Eyzies de Tayac, at the end of a wooded track which adds to the site's mysterious ambience, the Château de Commarque is home to a well-preserved castle-village, as well as a prehistoric cave housing some fine examples of cave art.

In 2018, the Romanesque- and Gothic-style rooms in the lower section of the castle will be open to the public and will host a new exhibition dedicated to Commarque's prehistoric cave, a listed historic monument. This new exhibition entirely dedicated to prehistory will enable visitors to discover the beauty of the cave and to learn about its scientific importance, thanks to its immersive displays, subdued lighting and background sound track. A 3D film will also present images of the cave's interior.

In addition, the whole site has been reproduced in 3D images, enabling visitors to experience the castle in a completely new way. Thanks to new technology, you'll learn about the evolution of the building, from the Neolithic period to the Middle Ages via a video screened in the Salle des Logis.

Spend the night at the **Château de Sauveboeuf**

Soak up the atmosphere of a candlelit dinner at the castle

After joining an evening guided tour (every Wednesday in summer), enjoy a candlelit dinner either in the large arcaded hall or outdoors (depending on the weather) at the Château de Sauveboeuf in Aubas, a property owned by Claude Douce, one of France's most successful advertising executives.

The castle grounds will be illuminated for the occasion, highlighting the beauty of this historic residence on the banks of the Vézère river, now full of interesting sights. Visitors have the option of staying at this charming 17th century castle (a listed historic monument), which has a studio and two "Nicolise" B&B rooms available for guests.

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EXCELLENT IN TRADITIONAL CRAFTSMANSHIP

Although traditional artisanal techniques are becoming harder to find in France, some of these are nonetheless gradually being revived. The Dordogne still has a few companies which continue to work traditionally, keeping these time-honoured production techniques alive for future generations.

Visitors can now participate in a traditional workshop in a setting full of history

The Vaux paper factory, in Payzac

This old 17th century forge was converted into a straw paper factory in 1861.

Today the Papeterie de Vaux, a listed historic monument, is a European ecomuseum dedicated to the production of straw paper.

This unique museum hosts artisanal papermaking workshops for adults and children alike, during which participants make and decorate their own sheet of paper.

A museum-workshop in Varaignes dedicated to weaving and the production of the famous **Charentaise slipper**

Housed in the Château de Varaignes in the northern Dordogne, this museum-workshop presents a host of regional weaving techniques, from working with hemp and wool to the traditional "cousu-retourné" technique used to make the Charentaise slipper.

The reconstruction of a 19th century weaver's house allows visitors to learn all about a traditional skill which has all but disappeared.

The castle rooms, all of which are named after local factories, recall the region's rich textile history, with a display of weaving looms and machines for cutting and sewing the famous Charentaise slippers.

The museum organises events and activities, including a Charentaise slipper-making workshop following which participants will receive their very own diploma in slipper making !

Situated a few hundred metres from the original cave, Lascaux II now offers visitors an in-depth visit by torchlight, recreating the atmosphere of the original cave.



Its "bistronomic" restaurant serves dishes made from fresh ingredients.

Christophe also hosts demonstrations of cooking over an open fire, in keeping with the traditions of bygone days.

New: "La rue du temps qui passe", a street which takes you back to the 1900s

Imagine being able to go back in the time and stroll along shopping streets as they were from 1860 to 1940.

Situated in the village of Allas les Mines, near some of the finest castles in the Dordogne valley, the "Rue du temps qui passe" museum takes visitors back to the late 19th century and early 20th century.

Head back to a time when electricity and running water were not part of our daily lives, when the motor car was just making its appearance on our roads, when knifegrinders sharpened knives in the street, and when your shoes were made by the local cobbler.

Michel BOOM, an enthusiastic owner of vintage cars, realised a collector's dream when he created a museum based around a period street which features reconstitutions of scenes from bygone days.

You'll be amazed by the museum's atmosphere, with its smell of turpentine bringing back memories of a traditional hardware store and its 28 shops which are full of fascinating items from the past, all of which you can discover on a visit lasting approximately 1 hour and a half.

This fascinating museum highlighting the region's past will bring back many moving memories for visitors.

Numerous movies have been filmed in this beautiful chateau, both filmed in its parkland and gardens as well as within the furnished rooms of the castle itself (17th and 18th centuries).

The last film shot here was "The Death of Louis XIV" (2015) by Albert Serra.


The site was awarded "NF Environnement" certification in 2016. It was the second site in France to receive certification and the first underground chasm.
